Notes:

1. A minimum of 128 credits are required to graduate from this department.
2. A maximum of 19 credits for courses outside CI/OP department may be included in the minimum credits required for elective professional courses.
3. Beginning with those enrolling in the academic year of 2009, students are required to take at least 12 credit hours of General Education courses. There are three disciplines within General Education – Humanities, Social Science and Natural Science. The courses are categorized into “Core Courses” and “Extended Courses” under each discipline. To meet the graduation requirements, students are required to take at least one 2- credit-hour course in each category of each of the disciplines.
4. Service-Learning at MCU must include 16 hours of service, a two-hour on-campus Service-Learning seminar, two Service-Learning Reflection reports and one hour of reflection or a fair which shares results.
5. Teacher education program may not be included in the total number of credits required for obtaining a Bachelor’s degree.
6. The CI/OP department requires one year of practicum training, which counts to 3 credits.
7. The elective courses on this Course Outline may be counted toward total graduation credits by students who entered the university prior to the 2010-11 academic years.
8. Also, the required courses of Career Orientation may be counted toward total graduation credits by students who entered the university prior to the 2010-11 academic years.
